Critical Delivery Service Program, which will deliver food and other vital necessities to older adults, dependent adults, and individuals with disabilities who are unable to leave their homes due to COVID-19. All items for delivery must be paid in advance through the store/market's website. This delivery service is free anywhere in Los Angeles County, 7 days a week. # School Grab and Go Meals (Los Angeles, Inglewood, Lynwood, and Compton) Compton

Grab and Go Meal Distribution. Students and Youth ages 18 and under can now pick up meals for 2 to 3 days at a time at no cost. Beginning Tuesday, March 31, 2020, CUSD will be moving to multiday meal service (2 breakfasts & 3 Lunches). Meals are available at seven sites: Clinton Elementary School (ES), McNair ES, McKinley ES, Longfellow ES, Rosecrans ES, Jefferson ES, and Kelly ES. The website does mention that no meals will be served during Spring Break (Week of April 13<sup>th</sup>).

• Grab and Go Meal Distribution. IUSD will provide meals at seven designated locations throughout IUSD:Woodworth-Monroe School, Hudnall Elementary School, Highland Elementary School, and Oak Street Elementary School and from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. at Centinela Elementary School. There will also be a mobile unit that will serve students at Bennett-Kew Elementary School from 9:45 a.m. to 10:45 a.m., and Worthington Elementary School from 11:00 a.m. to 12:30 a.m. Children may visit ANY of these schools to receive a "take home" meal.

Grab and Go Meal Distribution. LUSD provide meals, for children 1-18 years of age, on Mondays and Wednesdays only. On Mondays, each child will receive two (2) days worth of breakfast and lunch meals. On Wednesdays, each child will receive three (3) days worth of breakfast and lunch will be provided. The service will now be limited to two locations: Lynwood and Firebaugh High Schools.
